

**Town of Murray Board Meeting**

December 8, 2015

Present: Supervisor John Morriss, Councilwoman Kathy Case, Councilmen Ed Bower, Lloyd Christ and Paul Hendel, Town Clerk Cindy Oliver, Attorney Jeff Martin, Assessor Lynn Wood, Code Enforcement Officer Ron Vendetti, Legislator Ken DeRoller, Richard Downey Absent: Ed Morgan

Pledge to the flag.

Motion by Christ, Seconded by Hendel accepting the minutes of the November board meeting with the addition to the Precision Packaging resolution (pg. 2) stating that *the funds to pay one third of their fire pump bill will be coming from water districts 6 and 11.* Motion Carried

Legislator DeRoller updated all on the meeting with the Village of Holley relative to the Holley Business Park. They are focusing on how the infrastructure itself can benefit new businesses so county officials can better direct potential businesses there. It was a good start and the dialogue needs to continue to keep moving forward. Councilman Hendel thanked Legislators DeRoller and DeFilipps for spearheading the meeting. There are misconceptions regarding what the park can support as far as prospective businesses. Councilwoman Case asked if there is a clear title to the old abandoned high school. Legislator DeRoller said the title issue has not been resolved but thinks it can be resolved with the right leadership. There are other opportunities that can be pursued and a potential nine million dollar investment. Many things have to happen but Legislator DeRoller thinks we have the right people in place. *David Piedmonte entered the meeting.* Legislator DeRoller also stated that the county is continuing with the conversation regarding the parkway with letters going out to Assemblywoman Corwin, Assemblyman Hawley and Senator Ortt, all the way to the Governor's office and the D.O.T. Commissioner. Councilman Hendel said he appreciates Legislator DeRoller and Legislator DeFilipps coming to our meetings and keeping us abreast of what is happening within the County.

Assessor Lynn Wood reported that most of the past month has been spent on the 2016 update besides the resident walk-ins. Next week the exemption renewals will be mailed. The Board will have to start thinking about a candidate for the Board of Assessment Review as one of our members will be leaving. We will need another member appointed before grievance day in May. This term will expire in the fall of 2016. Lynn thinks yearly training for all B.A.R. members would be beneficial instead of just one training session per term.

Code Enforcement Officer Ron Vendetti has put the local laws in a codified book. Ron is proposing the Board adopt this as our code book and then we could begin looking at some of the older local laws that may need amending. He asked the Board to look it over as this is not final, and let him know what they think.

### Old Business

Councilwoman Case asked Jeff if he was able to find the law for parking on the side of the road. Jeff said he doesn't believe that law exists. Someone from the state saying they wouldn't object to parking on the side of the road outside the white line doesn't mean that it is a law. Ron reminded the Board that the Town sent a letter to DOT stating that the Town wanted to place 'no parking' signs in certain dangerous areas and the DOT stated they would agree with this if that is what the Town elected to do. Ron has 50 pictures of violations of A&M Automotive. Mr. Manno agrees that he will follow the rules but he does not. He also has pictures of the situation on Route 104. Ron is willing to listen to more discussion but we need to be serious about this issue. Someone has to start complying and showing a cooperative spirit instead of constantly arguing. Councilman Hendel suggested sitting down with interested parties in the spring or in late February and ask what their plan is and let them know that it must be dealt with.

Supervisor Morriss spoke with Mike Bove of Monroe Ambulance. Mike has spoken with the future Sheriff and that all is in place with a direct connect to our county dispatch so there will be no lost time. There will be an ambulance at the Brockport Rotary at all times. Even if they cut back, one will still always be there. They are also in the process of adding a fourth vehicle to the Brockport area. Jeff said that all the changes that were recommended at the work meeting have been incorporated in the contract and are signed and effective.

Motion by Bower, Seconded by Christ reappointing David Nenni to the Town Planning Board to a five-year term ending 12/31/2020      Motion Carried

Motion by Hendel, Seconded by Case reappointing Elaine Berg to the Zoning Board of Appeals to a five-year term ending 12/31/2020      Motion Carried

The year-end Town Board meeting will be held on Tuesday, December 29<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 p.m. Our organizational meeting will be held on the same evening as our regular January meeting, January 12<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m. Cindy will put an ad in the paper for the 2016 Town Board meetings.

Attorney Jeff Martin informed all that Jeff gathered the information together for the proposed water district extension. That information has been given to Paul Chatfield and Ed Morgan. They have the information they need in terms of bond repayment units.

We are in receipt of the Joint Recreation Agreement among the Village of Holley, the Towns of Murray and Clarendon and Holley Central School District. This is another five-year agreement that is effective through 2020.

Town Clerk Cindy reported November receipts totaling \$1,147.00 with \$427.75 going into the general fund.
