

Murray Town Board Work Meeting

May 24, 2014

Discussion on whether the Town should keep Water District No. 10, Ext. No. 1 open until the canal crossing can be readdressed in the fall. If we choose not to close this project we will could possibly be dealing with many unknown issues regarding the canal crossing. The Town Board is in agreement that we will aim to close the project by June 30, 2014. The Canal Corp will be notified that at this time, it is not the Town of Murray's intention to revisit the canal crossing.

Discussion regarding the code and inspection issues with A&M Automotive. Nathan Pace, attorney for Mr. Manno requested that the hearing be adjourned. If Mr. Manno allows Ron to inspect the property and if he makes an effort to come into compliance, the Board has agreed to allow him an adjournment. The Board reviewed the letter Jeff Martin drafted. All are in agreement that an inspection of the property by Ron Vendetti and Planning Board Chairman Charlie Felice within the next week is non-negotiable.

Highway and Water Superintendent Ed Morgan reported on the Palmyra auction. Used pick-ups were priced way too high. The Board is in agreement that the Town would be better off purchasing a new pick up using our proceeds from the auction with the balance coming out of the Highway Dept. budget. Motion by Hendel, Seconded by Christ authorizing Highway Superintendent Ed Morgan to purchase a new pick-up, not to exceed his budget Motion Carried
