Clarendon Supervisor Dick Moy

Gave his condolences for the loss of Ed Bower

He came to talk about the painting of the Clarendon water tower. As well as doing chlorination system upgrades. It could cost four to five hundred thousand to paint it inside and out. It holds 150,000 gallons of water, it will have to be emptied, and the cost for that will be included in the total. He spoke to the Water Authority, they can't provide any financial assistance. A \$200,000.00 grant has been secured to help with the bill. They also accumulated some money by charging their users \$18.99 a quarter for O&M. They will have a total cost for the project by June 28, 2018. He wanted to give The Town of Murray a heads up about the project and the estimated cost hoping that Murray would be able to contribute some financial assistance since about 1/3 of the water that passes through goes to Murray.

Councilman Hendel-Stated there is no money set in the budget at this time for the painting of the water tower. Once the bids are open on June 28th and you know what the cost will be, put a proposal in writing to Supervisor Miller on how much they would be asking for and he could present it to the Town Board.

Highway and Water Superintendent- Ed Morgan

Paved Hulberton Road and Lake Road; sealed Groth Road from 104 to Telegraph Road.

Found leak under Fancher Road that was due to corrosion. Attended school last week and, due to comments made a couple of meetings ago, asked other water Superintendents from Clarendon, Barre Albion, Gaines Yates, Shelby & Ridgeway what percentage of their water repairs are due to corrosion. They all said that about 90% of repairs are caused by corrosion.

With Skip still out on medical and Wayne with medical issues. Ed is interviewing a 20 year old college student for the summer at \$10.75 an hour. Need to keep in mind the minimum wage increase for budget purposes.

The neighbors of the Hulberton Road cemetery will give the easement so the town can cut the grass there. Asked if Jeff Martin could email him a copy of the original proposal.

Work on the Water district 3 Ext 1 will start after July 4th. The original valves have to be substituted with different Mueller valves, as they need to be American made.

Ed would like to replace the side mower from rotary to flail, for safety reasons.

Art Knab-Will more stone be added on Transit Road? Ed said yes.

Will you be paving Hulberton Road? Yes, next year, as it stands

When will new water district be started? Tentatively the week after July 4th. May start with W. Kendall Road.

Who cuts the grass by guard rails? Sometimes we use a sprayer, Skip usually mows so we have another guy doing it now, some days he is free to mow, other days he is not.

How many feet from the road does curb valve need to be? 25ft from the center of the road.

Kerri Neale- With the traffic coming into East Ave in the Village of Holley from Hurd Road and from the village. Caution signs & Children at Play signs are needed.

Kerri wanted to thank Bob Miller and Paul Hendel for the support at the Canal Corp. meeting at Albion Hoag Library about the canal banks and he is optimistic that the canal will be taken care of in the future.

Paul Hendel stated that, at the meeting he had talked to Jackie and she felt the best approach would be to get a group of Mayors and Supervisors together and that she would arrange it.
