PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

Tony Manno, owner of A&M Automotive has concerns regarding poor water drainage at the property.

Discussion between Mr. Manno and the Town Board about the issues causing the poor drainage. Mr. Manno is asking for advice and help in order to get the water flowing instead of sitting on the surface. Highway Superintendent Lammes said that the water isn't getting to the ditch by the railroad. He spoke to the state about this and the state said they have no intentions of doing anything. Dirk will be in touch with Mr. Manno to give recommendations of what Mr. Manno and/or the town can do.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Art Knab of 2753 Hindsburg Road commended Water Superintendent Lammes and the water crew regarding the water loss of 17.5%. They've done a great job.

Elaine Berg of 3211 Fancher Road asked when the live streaming was going to be used as it hasn't been used since February. Supervisor Sidonio said new connections were installed by the court. When Judge Spada returns from vacation he is hoping to get it sorted out. Ms. Berg said it was working fine in December, January and February. Supervisor Sidonio said it really wasn't working great at that time either.

David Piedmonte of 16797 Lynch Road said the Supervisor and himself were talking about when the Town fixed up the cemetery on Ridge Road and how much the clean up and improvements helped. Mr. Piedmonte thinks that the cemetery could use a tune up along with other cemeteries in the town such as the one on Hulberton Road.

Supervisor Sidonio said the town will be inheriting two cemeteries soon: Sandy Creek and Transit Cemeteries. There will be discussions soon regarding this.

Amy Machamer of 3803 Hurd Road spoke of other cemeteries including the ones on Telegraph Road that were once owned by someone in Connecticut. There are many that have been let go.

Water Superintendent Lammes would like everyone to have access to public water and he will stay in touch with them regarding this.

David Paul of 3823 County Line Road commented to Supervisor Sidonio about how Mr. Sidonio told our County Legislator that Mr. Paul is unfit to sponsor the Ride for the Blue. Supervisor Sidonio has no business saying anything about Mr. Paul when the Supervisor is a convicted, serious felon according to FBI records. Supervisor Sidonio said he is not a felon.

Councilman Mele informed all that Melissa Ierlan has high school students who are interested in helping with some of the cemeteries. If anyone sees her or the students there, that is the reason for it. Elaine Berg suggested possibly speaking to Samantha Zelent of the Holley Rotary about students helping out also.

HIGHWAY AND WATER

Milling of Hulberton and Telegraph Roads was finished and weather permitting, they will start paving this week.

The highway crew will be helping the county out until Wednesday. Then shoulder repairs. Ditching on Gulf and Groth Roads will also be completed.
